Social Work News

Aging Services is a non-profit organization partnering with Abbe Health and United Way who offers a variety of services in Linn, Johnson, Benton and Jones County to serve elders. They provide caregiver services including resource referral, support groups and a respite program. The chore home repair service provides small home repairs, yard care, snow removal and home adaptations (wheelchair ramps, grab bars, home rails) to anyone meeting eligibility guide-

lines. Volunteers are available for transportation to medical appointments, home visits to isolated elders and home safety checks. Milestones in Cedar Rapids and Marion and Pathways are adult day health centers where individuals over 18 can benefit from support and increase supervision. The Witwer Healthy Aging program provides activities in the community promoting Lifelong learning, Leisure and health and wellness. Aging Services also

Move Back During Medicare's 30-Day Window

Plan Ahead And Play It Safe.

So you or a loved one has been discharged from a hospital or skilled nursing facility after receiving Medicare benefits. You may have even been told that you're no longer eligible for Medicare coverage. But did you know that if your condition worsens during 30 days after the discharge or loss of eligibility, you may be reinstated for Medicare coverage? And you may be able to move in or move

back to a skilled nursing facility?

Medicare's "30-Day Window" can be confusing. Many patients of West Ridge Care Center are eligible for Medicare funding; we want to help explain the specifics of the 30-Day rule. To help you know your options and plan ahead for maximizing your Medicare benefits.

When do Medicare benefits apply?

A patient can continue care from a quality staff, recover in comfort and security and receive Medicare benefits under most

circumstances if:

- the person has been admitted to the hospital for three consecutive days, not counting the day of discharge
- the person is transferred to a nursing center for further care of the condition that was treated in the hospital, or other conditions requiring skilled nursing or rehabilitation services

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

- a physician certifies the patient requires skilled or rehabilitative care after a hospital stay

If a patient is cut from Medicare, a 30-day window exists where coverage may be reinstated.

Who may be eligible for the 30-Day Window of Medicare coverage?

Patients discharged from the hospital.

If a patient goes home from the hospital after three consecutive overnight stays*, and his or her condition worsens within 30 days, Medicare may cover

admitting the patient to a skilled nursing facility.

Patients discharged from a skilled nursing facility.

If a patient goes home from a skilled nursing facility, and his or her condition worsens within 30 days, Medicare may cover re-admitting the patient to a skilled nursing facility.

Patients cut from Medicare at a skilled nursing facility.

If a patient is staying at a skilled nursing facility and is no longer eligible for Medicare coverage - then has a significant change in

his or her condition - the patient may qualify to be reinstated to Medicare.

All of this can be very overwhelming. If you have questions and concerns please call and ask for Jill. I would be happy to meet with you and help you through the process.
